Paddlefest is a truly unique event focused on the mental and physical benefits paddling provides the community. Saturday is focused on providing the Fraser Coast community with the opportunity to experience all the benefits paddling provides on two of the most popular types of crafts (ocean skis and SUPs) used by the paddlers across the world in the Battle of the Paddle.

For those new to paddling, our Battle of the Paddle events are the perfect place to bring your friends and family to the beach and experience all the fun and excitement paddling can provide over a 500 m 'M' shaped course on polyurethane ocean skis and inflatable SUPs.

HERVEY BAY OCEAN CLASSIC PRIZE MONEY

For Single Ski prize money to be awarded, there must be at least five (5) entries in each age group. Where there are less than the minimum number of entries in an age group, competitors will be amalgamated to the most relevant age group so prize money can be awarded. For Single Ski paddlers who finish in the top five, they will also receive the Single Ski Age Group prize money if their age group meets the minimum entry criteria. For SUP, OC1, SUP-F, Double Ski and OC2 prize money to be awarded, there must be at least five (5) entries across all age groups.


















HERVEY BAY OCEAN CLASSIC GENERAL INFORMATION

DISTANCE

As the race distance will be 15 km.

FORMAT

The race will be run in one (1) stage with race markers (buoys) that must be negotiated as directed.

START METHOD

- The start method for the race will be a Beach Start.
- The Starter will call the athletes to the water's edge. Athletes will line up.
- All athletes will hold their craft, in ankle to thigh deep water as instructed by the Starter or assistants.
 When all athletes are aligned, and the conditions are favourable, the start signal will be given.

START PROCEDURE

- The Starter must ensure all boats are stationary behind the starting line.
- When the Starter is satisfied that the boats are aligned correctly and are stationary, they will call "Ready" followed by the start signal (a shot, starting horn, whistle blast or the word "Go").

FALSE START

- If an athlete moves forward after the word "Ready" and before the start signal, they have made a false start.
- An athlete who attempts to start before any instruction is deemed to have made an unfair start.
- An athlete who attempts a false or unfair start will be warned.
- The second warning will result in the imposition of a two (2) minutes penalty.
- The third warning will result in the athlete's disqualification from the competition.
- The disqualified athlete must leave the water immediately.















SHARK SIGHTING

On the sighting of a shark, immediately inform a Support Boat and leave the water until the shark is chased away from the support boat.

EVACUATION POINTS

- Support Boats will be with you on the course for the duration of the race.
- If you need assistance during the race, raise your paddle above your head so a support boat or fellow paddlers can see you until assistance arrives.
- In case of an emergency on land or water the patient will be transported to the Surf Life Saving Club Car park Emergency Areas.
- Water Evacuation Points will be the closest beach access point. When on course if Life Support is needed Volunteer Marine Rescue will be the first responders to enable First Aid, DFIB and fast boat access to an Emergency Medical Access point.

AWARDS

The awards are given according to the ICF protocol guidelines. The medals are awarded as follows:

1st place: a gold medal

2nd place: a silver medal

3rd place: a bronze medal

In double classes, each athlete will receive the appropriate medal.

To maintain the formality of the ceremony the athletes receiving medals must wear a Club or paddle top.















BY ENTERING THE HERVEY BAY OCEAN CLASSIC YOU AGREE TO THE FOLLOWING:

You understand the risks associated with Ocean Racing and acknowledge your responsibilities to help a distressed paddler.

YOU WILL COMPLY WITH THE MANDATORY SAFETY EQUIPMENT RULES:

- Lifejackets All competitors must wear an approved Australian Standard AS 4758 or International Standard ISO 12402 Lifejacket. All surf ski paddlers must wear an approved minimum Level 50 / Level 50S Lifejacket. Your lifejacket must be Hi-Vis or a Hi-Vis top is to be worn over the top of the lifejacket. No bum bag inflatable lifejackets are permitted.
- Safety Leash All competitors must be attached to their craft via a safety leash.
- SafeTrx Tracking All competitors MUST be logged in and using the Tracking Link Activity Code for the Hervey Bay Ocean Classic. SafeTrx allows the event organisers, spectators and water safety to track competitors live GPS location via the web. It is mandatory that all competitors carry a mobile phone and will be disqualified if they fail to follow this item of the safety plan.
- Timing Chip All competitors must wear the electronic timing chip on their ankle (right or left ankle).
 This will be provided at registration.
- Hi-Vis Clothing All competitors must wear a piece of Hi-Vis clothing. This can be a Hi-Vis lifejacket or Hi-Vis top worn over your lifejacket.
- Orange Smoke Flare All competitors must carry one in date orange smoke flare. The flare should be
 easily accessible when on the water. Ensure you are familiar in how to use a flare.















- Mobile Phone All competitors are required to have a mobile phone. A VHF Radio a distress beacon (EPIRB or PLB) can also be carried.
- Pealess Whistle All competitors are required to have a pealess whistle attached to their Lifejacket.
- SUP, SUP-F and Outrigger paddlers are permitted to wear an approved Lifejacket Level 100/150 bum bag inflatable lifejacket. A Hi-Vis top must be worn.

In the event of an emergency, a competitor's location can be identified via the SafeTrx App, the use of an orange smoke flare or via the sound of a whistle.

- In addition to the above we strongly recommend competitors carry a Distress Beacon (EPIRB or PLB) and /or a waterproof VHF Handheld Radio during the event. VHF handhelds are an inexpensive item of equipment that enables immediate contact between the competitor and safety vessels. In a boating emergency use Radio Channel 16 VHF or call 000 (triple zero)
- It is also recommended that a minimum of one (1) litre of water is to be carried during the race.
- Competitors should be Sun Safe, including wearing appropriate clothing and sunscreen.
- Footwear is strongly recommended.
- There is no storage or transport of craft provided at the race start and finish areas.
- The security of all equipment is the responsibility of each competitor.

There will be equipment scrutineering at the start line. Any competitor that does not abide by the rules and equipment requirements will be automatically disqualified.

START TRAINING WITH SAFETRX TODAY

DOWNLOAD THE SAFETRX APP, REGISTER AN ACCOUNT AND BECOME FAMILIAR WITH HOW THE APP WORKS DURING TRAINING.

- Use TRACK ONLY mode and share it with a friend or family member before you head out for a paddle.
- "Track Only" trips still record your trip on the handset (and to your trip history on the boaters website)
 and allows you to review and replay it later.
- Unlike "Sail Plan" trips, no ETA is provided and Coast Guard do not monitor your trip.







ADVANTAGES OF USING SAFETRX

- Using SafeTrx may save your life! Safety officials can track your position in real time during the race knowing where you are at all times.
- If you get into trouble you can activate the Call for Help button which enables you to call 000 or the Australian Volunteer Coast Guard – your exact GPS location will be available to them so the safety vessels can come to your aid
- Competitors can watch a replay of the event and see step by step how they raced against other paddlers and compare the lines they took against the winners
- Spectators can watch you race.
- Share your trip with your friends and family who can track your progress and meet you at the finish line to celebrate with you!
